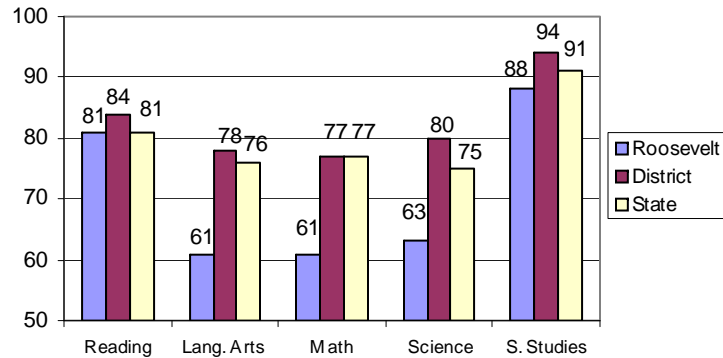


Fourth Grade Knowledge & Concepts Exam

Review & Attainment of 2007-08 Goals

We continued to collect data regarding our math goals of improvement in the area of math constructed response items on standardized tests. Our goal was to improve 15% in the next three years. We continue to move in the direction of that goal. Fourth grade students increased their standard scores by 10% and 5th grade students improved by 7%. In the area of reading, Roosevelt students scored advanced or proficient at 73% in 3rd grade, 81% in 4th grade, and 91% in 5th grade. Self and group assessment played an enormous role in that success. We used Response to Intervention to ensure that every student has the opportunity to be successful. We are well on our way to attaining our desired goal.

Goals for 2008-09

By the spring of 2008-2009, test scores will be 50% on 80% of the possible points on WKCE math constructed response items. Telling rubric test scores on district assessments will improve by 5%.

- We continued our Spanish in the Schools Program.
- We added a drama and art club.
- Family nights were well attended.
- Our relationship with Nestle allowed us to provide wonderful resources for our students.
- Fifth grade CHAMPS groups were instrumental in leading our students.

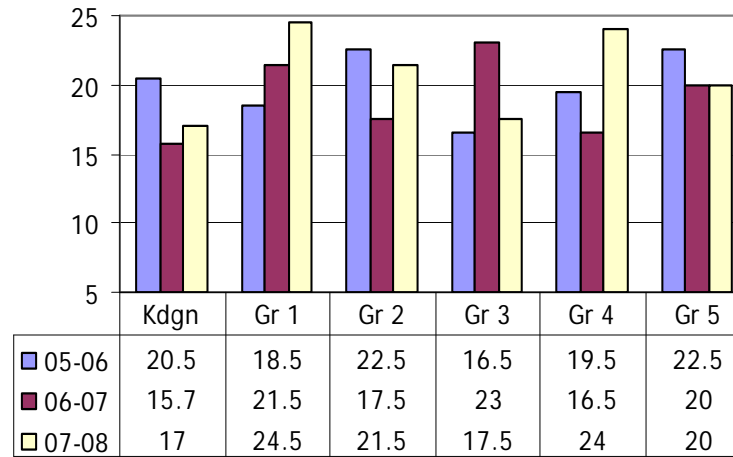

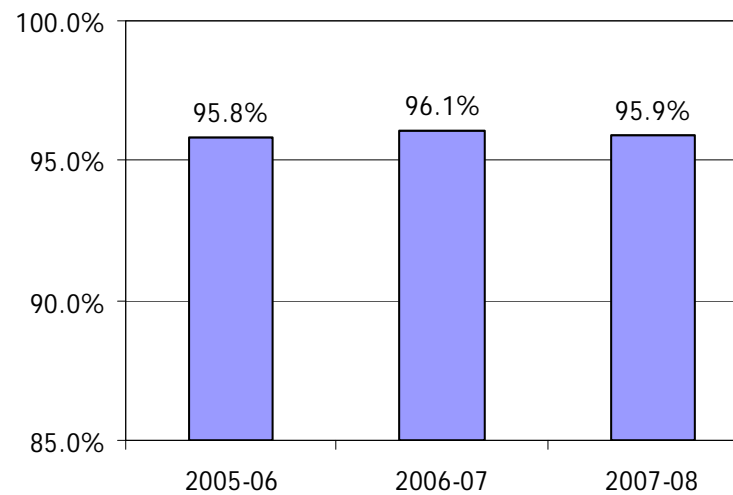

Average Class Size



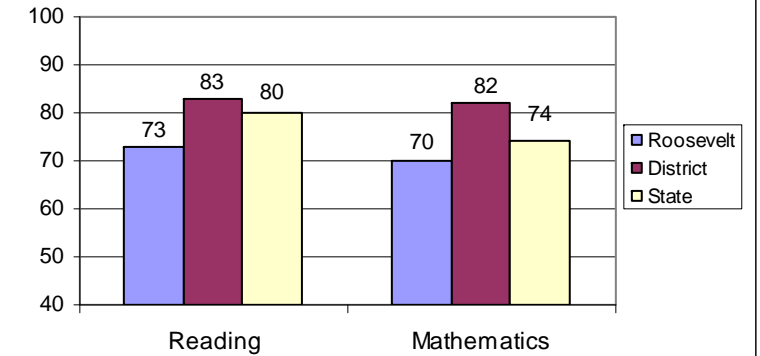
Average Daily Attendance

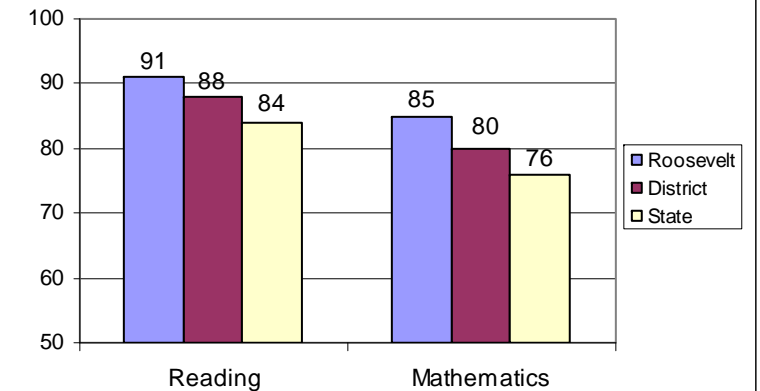
Third Grade Knowledge & Concepts Exam
